THE AGE-OLD GOLDEN CRAFTSMANSHIP - KUNDAN JEWELLERY

Kundan is one of the famous type of jewellery, which is an ancient form of jewellery that is adorned with gemstones and gold foil. Kundan is considered to be royal because its production is believed to have been originated in the royal courts of Rajasthan centuries ago. The word 'kundan' implies highly refined gold. The jewellery gets its name because of the skilled craftsmanship of encasing glass or gemstones in a base of gold foil made of highly refined and pure form of molten gold. It's production process also involves enameling with vivid colours on the reverse while the kundan design is on the front. It has a rich legacy of over 2500 years.

HISTORY

he roots of Kundan jewellery account back to the Indus valley civilization around 5000 years ago. Kundan jewellery is said to be brought to the country by the Mughals. While it dates back thousands of years, its origins can be traced to North India, mainly Delhi. It was popularized by the Mughals, and seen in the royal courts in their era. It then flourished in Rajasthan and Gujarat as well.



CRAFTSMANSHIP

he technique of making kundan jewelry involves setting gemstones, usually diamonds, rubies, emeralds, and sapphires, in pure gold. The gems are set in a framework of gold foil and then backed with lac, a resinous substance, which gives the jewelry its characteristic shine and depth. Kundan jewelry is known for its intricate designs and skilled craftsmanship. It requires highly skilled artisans who are proficient in setting the stones and shaping the intricate gold framework.

THE SOUTH INDIAN INFLUENCE

he fusion of South Indian influences with the traditional Kundan technique has resulted in unique and exquisite jewellery pieces that reflect the diversity of Indian culture. One significant influence from South India is the use of intricate motifs and designs inspired by South Indian temple architecture and traditional motifs such as mango, peacock, and floral patterns. These motifs are often incorporated into the Kundan jewelry designs, adding a distinct South Indian flavour to the pieces. 
